

# Wales: Summary table of COVID-19 restrictions by tier alert level

In Wales, the move to Alert Level 1 - Low Risk will be phased starting Monday 7th June For more details refer to Welsh government guidance on the GOV.WALES coronavirus website.

The table below summarises COVID restrictions and safety measures by activity (e.g. wedding/ funeral services, indoor exercise groups etc.). Where the information is available we provide guidance for different tier alert levels. To get the best out of this table, locate the activity in the first column that best fits your situation and then review the current and upcoming guidance for that activity.
